BUCKSHAW SPORTS

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BESIDES THE FACILITIES AT THE COMMUNITY CENTRE, BUCKSHAW IS ALSO HOME TO SUBSTANTIAL OUTDOOR SPORTING FACILITIES.

There are a number of mixed size football pitches, including a full size Astroturf pitch.

The pitch sizes, which are to FA standards, are used regularly by

many of the local sports clubs, Euxton Girls FC and Brinscall Village FC to name a couple of the clubs that regularly use the facilities.

There is an additional Multi-Use Games Area which offers a number of other sports including tennis, netball and Basketball.

The centre offers excellent car



parking facilities which allows surrounding communities to utilise the facilities and space.

These parking facilities are due to be upgraded to incorporate individual parking spaces and assigned spaces for disabled users in the near future.

We aim to continue to ensure the sporting areas are maintained to high standards to hopefully encourage local residents to use them and in turn helping residents to socialise, make new

friends and build an active and healthy community.

The facilities also offer changing rooms and shower facilities with another capacity to hold a home and away team for sports such as Football and Hockey.

DEFIBS AT BUCKSHAW FACILITIES

The local community and RMG working together to achieve potentially life saving equipment at Buckshaw

ver the past few weeks RMG have been working with the local community of Buckshaw Village and are delighted to announce that both the Sports Facilities and Community Centre now have been fitted with defibrillators.



We would like to say thank you to Jamie McGregor at The Buckshaw Business Hub, for all his passion & hard work on the project, Cheryl and her colleagues at the Northwest Ambulance service and everyone else who has contributed from beginning to end on helping get the defibs.

WHAT IS DEFIBRILLATION?

This is a common treatment for life-threatening cardiac dysrhythmias and ventricular fibrillation. Defibrillation consists of delivering a therapeutic dose of electrical energy to the heart with a device called a defibrillator.

The new defib's are at the front

entrances of both The Community Centre & Sports Pitches. Should, on the very rare occurrence they should be needed there are instructions on the front of the unit. Here is a summary of how they operate, as follows:

- 1 RING 999. The emergency service will supply a code.
- 2 Key in the code on the defibrillator unit and it will open up and the defib will be released from below.
- 3 Open the defib and follow the instructions which are told to you by the machine.

The details of the defibs have already been given to the



emergency services so when you dial 999 they will have the code to hand and be able to assist.

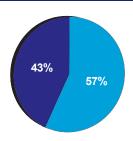
We have had quite a lot of interest from residents of Buckshaw about training and there will be sessions available at the community centre - a date of which will follow soon.

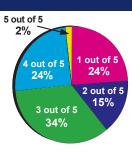
WHAT YOU WOULD LIKE FROM YOUR MANAGING AGENTS AT BUCKSHAW



Are you happy with the level of communication that RMG currently provide?

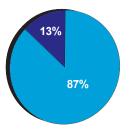


How do you rate your overall experience with RMG?

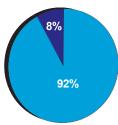

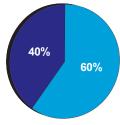

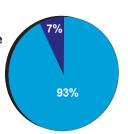

We also provides updates on present works and any details that can be shared including pictures of work that can be then be distributed across RMG's communication channels".





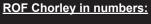


BLASTS FROM THE PAST

RMG have teamed up with local historian **Stuart Clewlow** to produce a new, regular feature detailing interesting facts about Buckshaw village.

or centuries the site of what is now Buckshaw Village was made up of the estates of Buckshaw Hall and Old Worden Hall and a number of farmsteads.

However in the mid 1930's an area of nearly 1,000 acres was compulsory purchased by the Government to build a large purpose built Ordnance Factory, and it became known as ROF Chorley. Construction began in 1936 and the factory was opened and in production from 1939 until 2007.



- The whole factory site cost £12 million to build, at the time the average house cost £400.
- 20 million bricks were used.
- 1 million cubic yards of concrete was used.
- The concrete was poured from an on site and purpose built mixer which was then the largest in the world at 120 feet tall and cost £30,000 to construct.
- The factories contained 300,000 square yards of glass
- Within the perimeter fencing of 6 miles was 50 miles of roads and pathways and 25 miles of railway track.
- The site contained 2,000 lamp posts.
- During World War Two around 40.000 people were employed at the Ordnance Factory.

A new South Ribble boundary sign will be erected shortly on Central Avenue. Our vision is to provide a clean, green and safe environment for all. Residents can do their bit by cleaning up after their dogs and not dropping litter.

South Ribble and Chorley have dedicated Neighbourhood Officers operating on Buckshaw with very similar roles, which

includes patrolling the area (independently and jointly) enforcing laws relating to dog fouling and littering.

RECYCLING CHANGES

News & Information provided by Chorley Borough Council

RESIDENTS WHO
WANT TO DISPOSE OF
CONSTRUCTION AND
DEMOLITION WASTE FOR
FREE AT LANCASHIRE
COUNTY COUNCIL'S
RECYCLING CENTRES NOW
NEED TO APPLY FOR A
PERMIT.

LCC brought in a permit system on 1 June 2015, to limit how much construction and demolition waste people can dispose of for free at Household Waste Recycling Centres, with charges being applied for any extra.



The free permit allows people to dispose of up to ten 25kg bags of construction and demolition waste a year without charge.

A charge of £3.50 per 25kg

bag or equivalent item will be applied for any further waste, or for any waste delivered without a permit. Permits are valid for a calendar year, or until the free allowance has been used.

"Lancashire County Council needs to save costs of £315 million by April 2018."

This new system does not affect recycling and the disposal of normal household waste which can be taken to HWRCs as usual without the need for a permit, but it will help to reduce the £750,000 annual cost of dealing with 'inert' waste such as soil, rubble, ceramics such as toilets and sinks, and plasterboard. LCC needs to save £315m by April 2018.
